# Ecclesiastes: Wisdom & Folly

Ecclesiastes 11 & 12

### Investing Wisely (11:1-8)

- It is wise to <u>divest</u> our interests (11:1-2, 6) • Both <u>financially</u> and otherwise
- Because life is <u>unpredictable</u> & <u>uncontrollable</u> at times • Like the <u>rain</u> & the <u>wind</u> (11:3-4) • Like how a child is formed in the womb (11:5a)
  - Mysterious & perhaps unknowable
- But these reflect the way <u>God</u> works in the world (11:5b) • Thus, we should invest in <u>eternal</u> things
- We should not waste time worrying about what <u>might</u> happen, but rather deal with things as they are (11:4)
- Thus, we should live life to the <u>fullest</u> (11:7-8a) • While remaining aware of the <u>risks</u> (11:8b)

### On Aging, Death & Contentment (11:9-12:7)

- We should enjoy life while we can, making the most of <u>opportunities</u> (11:9a) • While remaining aware of our <u>standing</u> before God (11:9b)
  - oLiving with <u>eternity</u> in mind (11:10a)
    - In a way that pleases <u>God</u>
    - And gives freedom from <u>stress</u>
- We are reminded that our youth is <u>fleeting</u> (v. 10b-12:7) oUsing various illusions to the process of <u>aging</u>
- These are the reflections of an aged man who lives with <u>regrets</u> oHis advice: Make <u>God-honoring choices</u> now so you have nothing to regret later

# The Conclusion of the Matter (12:8-14)

- Solomon concludes by repeated his call of *hebel* (vanity)
- He reflects on his own desire to share <u>wisdom</u> (12:9-10) • Claiming that wisdom is meant to <u>move</u> us <u>forward</u> (goads), and <u>anchor</u> us (nails) (12:11) • While coming from <u>God</u> alone (one Shepherd)
- But even wisdom has its limits and should be pursued in measure (12:12)
- What is not *hebel*, what has real meaning is <u>God</u> alone (12:13) • Thus, we should <u>revere</u> and <u>love</u> Him • And live with <u>eternity</u> in mind (12:14)

### So What?

- Are we living wisely by making the most of opportunities and investing in eternity?
- Are we finding our life's meaning in God alone?
