The Gospel of John:

Mission & Belief (John 20:19-29)

The Commission (v. 19-23)

- The evening of the day of Jesus' <u>resurrection</u>, the disciples are meeting

 OThe doors are locked because they feared the Lewish leadership might have them as
 - oThe doors are <u>locked</u> because they feared the Jewish leadership might have them <u>arrested</u> and killed as well
- Jesus appears in their midst
 - oIn His resurrected form, Jesus is not bound to the <u>physical</u> constraints of this world anymore, evidenced by His passing through His <u>grave-clothes</u> & the <u>locked</u> door
- "Peace be with you" (v. 19, 21) is more than a greeting; it is a fulfillment of His promise (14:27; 16:33)
 - oPeace: Reconciliation & life with God
- He sends them to continue His <u>mission</u>
 Offering <u>forgiveness</u> is a summary of this mission
- <u>Breathing</u> on them as a symbol of the giving of the <u>Holy Spirit</u> oThe Spirit's <u>presence</u> & <u>power</u> are essential for us to continue Jesus' mission

The Doubter (v. 24-29)

- Thomas was not present when Jesus first appeared to the disciples
 - ODespite hearing their testimony about seeing the resurrected Jesus, he says he won't <u>believe</u> without <u>physical proof</u>
 - He not only wants to see but also touch the wounds
- Another week passes, and the disciples are meeting behind <u>locked</u> doors again OJesus <u>appears</u>, with the same <u>greeting</u>
- He addresses Thomas, offering the <u>proof</u> he claimed to need
 - OHe tells him to stop doubting and start believing
 - Both doubt & belief are active choices
- Thomas responds with the most explicit declaration of Jesus' <u>identity</u> in the Gospel oMy Lord: Jesus is the <u>Messiah</u> oMy God: Jesus is <u>God incarnate</u>
- Jesus responds by <u>affirming</u> Thomas' faith oBut asserts that those who believe without <u>physical evidence</u> are <u>blessed</u> (1 Pet 1:8-9)

So What?

- Do we need physical evidence to put our faith in Jesus, or is our trust in His finished work?
- Are we relying on the Holy Spirit to continue the mission of Jesus?
