# The Gospel of John: The Gospel in Action (John 21:1-23)

### Fish for Breakfast (21:1-14)

- Jesus appears to the disciples for a third time • This time, 7 of them are there, including <u>Peter</u> & <u>John</u>
- Peter and the others go out <u>night fishing</u> in the <u>Sea</u> of <u>Galilee</u>

  After a <u>fruitless</u> night, they come to shore to see that an <u>unrecognized</u> Jesus is waiting for them
- Jesus asks if they have caught anything, and instructs them to throw their nets on the right side of the boat
  - This results in a massive haul of 153 fish, which miraculously doesn't tear the nets
- This prompts the beloved disciple (<u>John</u>) to realize that the man is <u>Jesus</u>, because this had happened <u>before</u> (Lk 5:1-11)
  - oThis realization leads <u>Peter</u> to jump out of the boat and start swimming to shore, leaving his friends to do with the abundance of fish
- When they get to shore, they find that Jesus has begun preparing a <u>meal</u> for them to share, telling them to add some of the newly-caught fish to the breakfast
  - Despite this act of fellowship, one disciple may have felt unsure of his place among the disciples: <u>Peter</u>

### The Restoration (v. 15-19)

- After the meal, Jesus pulls Peter aside (v. 20)
- He asks Peter if he <u>loves</u> Jesus more than 'these'
   Peter replies by proclaiming that Jesus knows that he does indeed <u>love</u> Him
   Jesus then commands Him to <u>feed</u> His <u>sheep</u>
- Jesus repeats this question <u>3</u> times, once for each time Peter <u>denied</u> Him oBy doing so, Jesus is demonstrating that Peter is both <u>forgiven</u> and <u>reinstated</u> as a true disciple who will help <u>lead</u> the Church in Jesus' mission
  - The command to feed/tend Jesus' sheep/lambs is for Peter to be an <u>under-shepherd</u> to the <u>Good Shepherd</u>
- Jesus then tells Peter that his promise to follow Him to the <u>death</u> will be fulfilled (Jn 13:37) OAnd even how that will happen: <u>crucifixion</u>
- Despite this, Jesus calls Peter to follow Him

# The Rumor (v. 20-23)

- Peter asks Jesus what John's fate will be
- However, Jesus responds that John's fate is not Peter's concern; obedience to Jesus is
- Jesus' response later led to a rumor that John wouldn't <u>die</u> before Jesus' return, though that was not what He said
  - OIn fact, He promised the opposite (Mk 10:35-40)

#### So What?

- Jesus forgives and restores us when we seek Him. Are we seeking Him?
- Are we focusing on our own obedience to Jesus?
